Our Year in Review

The Officers and members of the Gilbertsville Fire & Rescue Company are proud to present the following information of our activities in 2021.

We responded to 270 calls for service in 2021. This is a decrease from 284 calls for service in 2020. Members logged 772 hours and 48 minutes on emergency incidents.

This was our seventeenth full year of providing fire, rescue and emergency services to the residents, businesses and visitors of Douglass Township. We continue to have the responsibility of acquiring additional resources and updating equipment as needed. The fire department improved tactical and strategic operations with extensive training and planning. On the financial side, the fire department was able to maintain its level of service and started the construction of a new firehouse facility.

From its inception in 2005 to the present, the Gilbertsville Fire & Rescue Company has been and today remains a "family" comprised of 32 Volunteer Firefighters, 6 Fire Police Officers, 1 Junior Firefighter, 6 Explorer Firefighters and an additional 10 contributing members who dedicate themselves to protecting their fellow residents, neighbors, businesses and others needing emergency assistance.

For the volunteers who continue to provide the foundation of the department and its services, it is worthy to note that their personal and professional commitments and dedication continue to save the township and its taxpayers millions of dollars per year. They have responded to every call received for emergency assistance in Douglass Township and neighboring communities without being hindered by hazardous weather or time of day/night.

In a profession where volunteers place their lives and safety on the line each day, and on each emergency to which they respond, these factors each highlight the true value of the Volunteers of Gilbertsville Fire & Rescue Company.

Grants Received





In 2021, we received the following grant funding sources to assist in supplementing our fire and rescue services:

Berks County Community Foundation Boyertown Fund - \$7,500.00 *To fund the installation of a vehicle exhaust system in the new station.*

Montgomery County Resiliency Grant - \$50,000.00

To reimburse for costs associated with the construction of our new firehouse.

PA State Fire Commissioners Grant - \$14,440.00

Purchase of firefighting equipment – Squad 67

FEMA Assistance to Firefighters Grant Program –

\$ 62,572.00 – Regional grant to purchase 9 sets of firefighter turn out gear

\$ 95,453.00 – Regional grant to purchase of new fire hose and appliances.



Special Recognition

Gilbertsville Fire and Rescue Company is proud to announce that we have obtained recognition from the Pennsylvania State Fire Commissioner for 75% of our firefighting staff being certified at various levels in accordance with nationally recognized and sanctioned professional qualification standards.

With this recognition, our department has demonstrated that we are competent and capable of providing quality fire and rescue services to the residents and visitors of this Commonwealth.

The Participating Department Recognition Program is designed to recognize departments that support, promote and encourage their emergency response personnel to voluntarily certify in accordance with nationally recognized standards.

Gilbertsville Fire and Rescue Company is one of 67 participating departments in the State of Pennsylvania and 1 of 9 participating departments in Montgomery County to obtain a 75% certification recognition.













In 2021, the membership continues to grow our explorer and junior programs designed to attract the youth in our community. These programs are designed for retention and recruitment of new members for the future of our organization.
